Coral McVean provided a complete set of basic instructions on how to recognize strokes, the different types and symptoms and also on how to minimize the risk of having one. Please check your blood pressure regularly and reduce salt intake to keep it as low as possible. Everyone received a pocket card on the acronym FAST (Face, Arms, Speech, Time). If a stroke is suspected or identified get medical help immediately. A FAST time to hospital for specialist treatment is critical.

### Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> February- Board Games





This will be a combined walk and social get together. The venue is the Maroochy


Botanical Gardens, Palm Creek Road, Tanawha.
