Members Spot

Ann McLeod told us how she grew up in Cape town and in 1963 with her family moved to England due to the tension and hostilities in South Africa. She did a business secretary course and then joined the merchant navy. She later joined P&O as a junior assistant purser on the Heritage world tour. She later met her future husband lan on one of her cruises and married in Leeds Yorkshire. They

both moved to Fiji on 3 years teaching contracts. They then moved to Sydney to raise their 3 children who are now all in the Navy. Ann and Ian now have 5 grandchildren to spoil. Whilst in Sydney they started camping and caravanning with the family. In 2016 they sold their family home of 40 years in Sydney and moved to Ettalong Beach on the Central Coast NSW where they started caravanning around Australia and in 2023 moved into Natures Edge Village at Forest Glen.



Our May Speaker:

Ralph Devlin started his presentation with an overview of the Maroochy Surf Club where he is Life Governor and its impressive achievements since it was established in 1916. Originally the club was Royal Club and run from England until the 1930's when it and

other saltwater surf lifesaving clubs were ceded to the Sydney Surf Lifesaving Association. Maroochy Surf Club has produced 10 Olympic swimming or lifesaving champions. The Club is hoping for its first female president to be elected this year. Ralph talked about advocacy as a barrister meeting the client, listening to the client, deciding whether they had a defence and trying to make them see sense if they did not. He remarked that most clients had some decent traits. Some of the more well-known cases he has been involved with were The Fine Cotton scandal, the Fitzgerald enquiry and the Dreamworld tragedy

He provided a few examples of cases where it was important to listen closely to the clients. He told us of a teacher who was accused of sexually assaulting 2 boys. After he started investigating the claims it became apparent that the ring leader of the boys had been suspended by the teacher from school for 5 days for fighting. The teacher had also told the boy's mother that he suspected the boy was dealing drugs at the school. The mother had informed the police of that fact and the boy decided to seek revenge on the teacher. At the court case it all was revealed and the teacher was found completely innocent of the crimes. This case made national news around Australia.

He was very critical of how government departments tried to pressure trials, and quite often, were trying to hide serious deficiencies in the application of standards and safety issues.


As an example of this talked of a grazier driving his low loader between farms and crossing some railway lines. The crossing was so poorly designed that he could not see the approaching train. The empty train was derailed and even though no one was hurt the grazier was sued for \$12 million dollars by the railway authority. Ralph found that 12 faults previously recognised by the authorities pertaining to that crossing had not been enacted upon nor the information given to the police by the railways. The case was dismissed.

Ralph finished his presentation by showing his singing talents which he uses in his group The Tatty Tenors.

He sang a song from a Gilbert and Sullivan production of "Trial by Jury" and by popular demand, a song from the 3 Tenors.

All our members thoroughly enjoyed his talk and look forward to next time he comes to our

meeting as guest speaker.


