In 1976 she came back to Australia and resumed working at North Shore hospital. then worked for 5 years at a pathology clinic. She met her husband and they had 2 children living on the northern beaches. She worked at a nursing home for 5 years and became deputy matron. She split with her husband and resumed working in a Sydney public hospital. Her daughter had moved to Queensland and her son had moved to the Sunshine Coast. As her 2 grandchildren moved with their parents Dot also decided to move to Pacific Paradise and loves her life here.

Our June Speaker:

Dr Christopher Reynolds was unable to appear due to a commitment to appear as a witness in a court case. Instead, we watched his two presentations on You Tube.

The first was about his book launch in June 2024 and the second of a presentation that he gave in Sydney. His book challenges the current thinking on Australian history at the time of English settlement showing that rather than just a penal colony it was settled for political reasons to keep the French out of the pacific as well as Christian beliefs in trying to improve the lives of the new settlers. He stated that the majority of prisoners were released within 2 years and were given their own land




Friday 13th June - Golf Report


